The Kosher Laws are Torah's guide to those foods that affect the Jewish soul adversely. Any meat or fowl that is eaten must be slaughtered in a pre-scribed, humane fashion. Meat and milk must never mix. Scavengers, predatory beasts and fish, shellfish and certain other animals are forbid-den. Any processed foods must be produced under strict supervision.

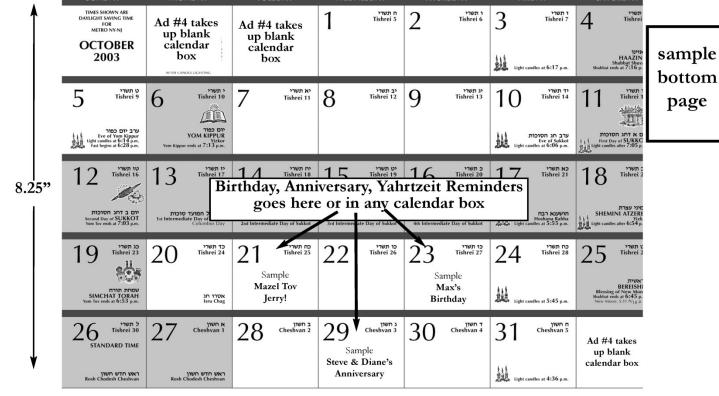
